The SSR report was robust, covering decentralized governance, strategic planning, infrastructure expansion, and institutional policies. AIT's governance is transparent and well-defined, being Army-managed, with clear SOPs and grievance mechanisms. In light of the comprehensive evidence and institutional maturity, AIT respectfully submits that the grade of 3 under Metric 6.2.1 does not accurately reflect its strategic efforts.	The GC is working for sustained institutional growth, decentralization, participation in the institutional governance and in their short term and long term plans. The institution has developed a perspective plan which is effectively deployed and is functioning. Bodies are effective and efficient as visible from policies, administrative setup, appointment, service rules, and procedures.

HEI comments for the metric:

1. AIT has a well-defined system for monitoring and evaluating the implementation of institutional policies and plans, with biannual reviews conducted by IQAC and HODs, and reports submitted to CDC and AWES, as well as to the local military authorities. i.e. HQ Southern Command.
2. Strategic plans are shared with the Governing Body and departments for timely execution, and all related documents are publicly available on the AIT website.
3. Institutional bodies such as CDC, IIC, and Grievance Committees function effectively, meeting statutory requirements and interacting regularly with leadership.
4. AWES governs AIT with clearly published service rules, which are updated as needed, and all SOPs and policies are accessible to staff and students. SOP are formed after taking inputs from all stake holders, brainstorming and corrections done after feedbacks.
